Following an extensive renovation, the National Library of the Philippines (NLP) Building is once again emerging as a popular venue for a diverse range of events. The renewed NLP Lobby and Epifanio Delos Santos Auditorium have recently hosted significant gatherings, including a book launch and a unique exhibition promoting peace, climate justice, and Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Book Launching at the NLP Auditorium

In a celebration of literature and historical exploration, the NLP Epifanio Delos Santos Auditorium played host to a significant book launch event on December 27, 2022. Esteemed author Mr. Virgilio C. Leynes presented his latest work, "The Filipino Tragedy and Other Historical Facts Every Filipino Should Know," captivating a diverse audience eager to delve into the rich tapestry of Philippine history.

Mr. Leynes, a respected figure in the accountancy, business, and literary communities, shared insights into the inspiration behind his latest work. Published on August 28, 2022, the book spans 569 pages and is written in English, with translations into

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Filipino for key topics. It serves as a compilation of the author's ideas, opinions, and arguments on personalities, events, and places during the tumultuous period of Philippine history (1896-1906). The book closely examines historical events that many consider controversial and some that are unknown to the general public.

SDGs ResiliArt Exhibit and Heritage Animated Book Launch at the NLP Lobby

March 15, 2023, witnessed the launch of the SDGs ResiliArt Exhibit by the Philippine Center of International Theatre Institute (ITI). Earthsavers DREAMS Ensemble - UNESCO Artist for Peace, and ITI Social Change Network, in partnership with the NLP and in collaboration with the Department of DFA-UNACOM, Education. Philippine Commission on Women, National Commission for Culture and the Arts (NCCA), Association of Local Colleges and Universities, Universidad de Manila, and Asia TV Studios. The exhibit, located at the 2nd Floor Lobby of the NLP Building, featured artistic creations promoting peace and climate justice. It also included heritage-based book launches, aligning with UNESCO concerns for early childhood education.

The event is a conjoined celebration of UNdesignated annual observances for the month of March, namely the International Days for Women, Elimination of Racial Discrimination, Disarmament and Non-Proliferation Awareness, Water, Forests, and Poetry, and the ITI World Theatre Week. It was an opportunity to salute outstanding women leaders of the Philippines.

The exhibit showcased the works of notable artists, such as the Angono-based acclaimed veteran visual artist Nemi Miranda, considered the "Father of Imaginative Figurism" and founder of the Angono Ateliers Association, and Zimbabwean artist-musician Xander Pratt, a CNN Africa's top 10 Avant Garde awardee. They presented their featured art collections that resonate with the message of peace, women empowerment, and other SDGs.

World Read Aloud Day



In a groundbreaking move toward inclusivity and accessibility, the National Library of the Philippines (NLP) has partnered with the National Historical Commission of the Philippines (NHCP) to make three significant special collections available to the public. The collections in focus— the Philippine Revolutionary Records, the Historical Data Papers, and the Jose Rizal Collection— will be accessible online for free through NHCP's National Memory Project (NMP).

This initiative underscores a commitment to democratizing access to valuable historical resources. The NMP, accessible via the NHCP's website, is designed to provide free online access to a myriad of Philippine history materials housed in various libraries, archives, and museums nationwide, as well as in collaborating institutions.

The Philippine Revolutionary Records offer insights into the nation's struggle for independence, chronicling pivotal moments during the revolutionary period. The Historical Data Papers provide a comprehensive view of significant events and individuals in Philippine history, while the Jose Rizal Collection presents materials related to the national hero, Dr. Jose Rizal, and his contributions to the country.

The NLP and NHCP envision that this collaborative endeavor will empower researchers, students, and the general public to explore and delve into the rich tapestry of Philippine history. By embracing digital accessibility, these institutions hope to foster a deeper understanding of the nation's past,

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cultivating a sense of national identity and pride.

As the NLP joins forces with the NHCP to democratize access to these invaluable collections, it marks a significant step forward in the preservation and dissemination of Philippine historical heritage. The collaboration between these two esteemed institutions reflects a shared dedication to making history a shared and accessible treasure for all.

NLP and CDA Joined Hands to Promote Cooperative Knowledge

In a significant step towards fostering cooperative awareness and knowledge dissemination, the NLP and the Cooperative Development Authority (CDA) joined hands through the signing of a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) on June 15, 2023. The primary objective of the MOA is to inaugurate a dedicated cooperative section within the NLP. This initiative envisions establishing a knowledge hub, showcasing an array of books, research papers, and other valuable resources. The curated collection aims to empower individuals by providing insights into the opportunities, benefits, and transformative power of cooperatives.

For the time being, the Cooperative Section will be housed at the Common Service Area, located on the ground floor of the NLP Building. This temporary arrangement is expected to evolve into a dynamic and comprehensive resource center, fostering a culture of cooperation and collaboration within the society.

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UNODC, BJMP, AND NLP COLLABORATE TO LAUNCH "READ YOUR WAY OUT" PROJECT, TRANSFORMING PRISON LIBRARIES



A collaborative project between the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC), the Bureau of Jail Management and Penology (BJMP), and the National Library of the Philippines (NLP), the "Read Your Way Out" Project was launched on March 14, 2023 at Novotel, Quezon City.

In a concerted effort to promote education, rehabilitation, and well-being among persons deprived of liberty (PDL), the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC), in partnership with the Bureau of Jail Management and Penology (BJMP) and the National Library of the Philippines (NLP), officially inaugurated the Read Your Wav Out (RYWO) Proiect. This transformative initiative was launched on March 14, 2023, at Novotel, Quezon City, following a preliminary visit by UNODC officials to the NLP on March 23, 2023.

The UNODC delegation, along with members of the Technical Working Group (TWG), visited the NLP on March 13, 2023. The delegation included Lisa Krolak, Chief Librarian of the UNESCO Institute of Lifelong Learning in Hamburg, Germany; Jane Garner, a lecturer in the School of Information Studies at Charles

Sturt University in Australia; Kate Jones, a resource speaker on the role of education in reformation; Nathee Chitsawang, a resource speaker on best practices of the Living Library in Thailand; and Padma Bandaranayake, a resource speaker about how libraries support rehabilitation from Sri Lanka. The NLP is also a

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part of the TWG, providing technical expertise in terms of library management.

During the visit, UNODC officials explored the services and facilities of the library, gaining insights into the valuable resources available. This exchange served as a precursor to the collaborative efforts that would unfold in the subsequent launch of the RYWO Project.

The genesis of the RYWO project lies in the Nelson Mandela Rule 64, advocating for the establishment of prison libraries, and the International Federation of Library Associations and Institutions (IFLA) Guidelines for Library Services to Prisoners. These provide guidelines a framework for implementing and customizing library services within correctional facilities. The RYWO project, also known as "Magbasa Tungo sa Paglaya," aligns with these principles, aiming to create new jail libraries across the Philippines.

The project not only focuses on the physical setup of libraries but also emphasizes the provision of books and equipment. The overarching goal is to offer learning opportunities that facilitate personal development, well-being, and rehabilitation for individuals within the correctional system. A key aspect of the initiative is to encourage reading activities among PDLs, allowing them to earn Time Allowance for Study, Teaching, and Mentoring (TASTM). This incentivizes educational pursuits, leading to reduced sentences and aiding in decongestion through early release coupled with rehabilitative efforts grounded in improved education and vocational skills.

The official launch at Novotel, Quezon City, included the signing of a Declaration of Cooperation among the concerned agencies. Signatories to the declaration included Serafin P. Barreto Jr., Undersecretary for Public Safety of the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG); Jail Director Allan S. Iral, Chief of BJMP; Atty. Joyce Jazmin G. Dimaisip-Cunanan, Supreme Court Senior Chief Staff Officer; Olivier Lermet, Senior Policy Advisor of UNODC; and Cesar Gilbert Q. Adriano, Director of NLP.



The Declaration of Cooperation was signed by officials from the DILG, BJMP, Supreme Court, UNODC, and NLP.





NLP Boosts Employee Preparedness with Disaster Seminar

The NLP took a proactive step in enhancing the safety and preparedness of its employees through a Disaster Preparedness Seminar held on February 23, 2023. The seminar, which focused on earthquake and fire preparedness in workplaces, was organized by the Public Service Continuity Plan and Disaster Control Committee of NLP. from the Philippine Red Cross collaborated with NLP to provide a Basic Volunteer Orientation course. Mr. Don Jorge S. Marcos, Disaster Preparedness Technical Officer, delved into the fundamentals of disaster preparedness, equipping attendees with essential knowledge to respond effectively to potential emergencies. Mr. Angelo Tan, Chapter Service Representative of Disaster Management Service, conducted a short tabletop exercise. This exercise involved a sample scenario to train members of the Continuity Core Team and Incident Emergency Response Team on appropriate measures before, during, and after earthquakes or fires.

A significant highlight of the seminar was the practical demonstration of fire extinguisher operation, skillfully facilitated by Mr. Tan. This hands-on experience provided NLP employees with the opportunity to apply their knowledge, ensuring they are well-prepared to handle firerelated incidents.

In addition to the extensive physical collection housed at NLP, the library is expanding its services by offering free access to electronic resources for all library users. This training session was a crucial step in ensuring that NLP clients receive the necessary guidance to make optimal use of these digital materials, complementing the traditional resources available at the library.

NLP Empowers Public Libraries with Extensive Training-Series

The NLP, through its Public Libraries Division (PLD), has successfully completed the first three parts of its comprehensive Training-Series on Delivering the Basics of Quality Public Library Service. The program, spanning from May to July 2023, aims to fortify and recalibrate the quality of public library services across the country.



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The training-series was designed for all affiliated public libraries of the NLP. It comprised a five-part series, covering critical areas such as Public Libraries' Mission/Vision, Goals, and Objectives; Collection Development and Management; Services of Public Libraries; Physical Facilities and Public Library Administration; and Financial Resources, Partnerships, and Collaboration.

On May 25, 2023, the PLD hosted the first part of the training-series at the NLP Function Room, attracting 61 participants from both within and outside the National Capital Region. Resource speakers, including Ms. Lucila Raquino of Quezon City Public Library and Ms. Rochelle Silverio of the Valenzuela City Public Library, led sessions on exploring the basic theories and concepts behind the current Standards for Public Libraries. NLP Director Cesar Gilbert Q. Adriano and PLD Chief Blesila P. Velasco provided leadership and support.



The first part of the training-series was participated by 61 librarians and library staff within and outside NCR.



The second part, held on June 6, 2023, at Purok Marcela Beach Resort in Lingayen, Pangasinan, was attended by 75 individuals, including NLP organizers, Pangasinan Provincial Library (PPL) and Provincial Government of Pangasinan staff. The training focused on community needs analysis and the development of a collection development plan, with resource speakers Ms. Kima Sirot of Asingan Municipal Library, Ms. Virgie Aquino of Alaminos City Library, and Ms. Bernadine Gravela of Urdaneta City Public Library.



The second part was held in Lingayen, Pangasinan, with 75 participants.



On June 7-8, 2023, sub-groups visited various municipalities of Pangasinan to validate the existing 2015 Revised Standards for Philippine Public Libraries (RSPPL) and monitor inactive public libraries, joined by selected staff from PPL.



PLD and PPL staff visited various municipalities in Pangasinan to validate the 2015 RSPPL.

Series 3 unfolded on June 27, 2023, in Lucena City, Quezon, in partnership with the Provincial Government of Quezon through the Quezon Provincial Library. Public librarians, officers-incharge, and staff from Quezon Province and nearby areas participated in discussions about services based on the 2015 RSPPL. Invited speakers, including Ms. Joana Paola C. Tuazon of Camarines Norte Provincial Library, Ms.

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Amylen N. Bautista of Albay Provincial Library and Information Center, and Mr. Federico N. Vinluan of Raul S. Roco Library, shared expertise and experiences.



The third part was held in Lucena City, Quezon on June 27, 2023.



Series 4 and 5 are slated for July, marking the continuation of NLP's commitment to enhancing public library services nationwide.

NLP's "eResources Day" Empowers Legislative Library Services

The NLP, through the Reference Division (RD), recently conducted two insightful sessions of "NLP eResources Day" for the personnel of the Legislative Library Service and Legislative Records and Archive Service of the Legislative Reference Bureau, Senate of the Philippines. The events took place on May 3 and May 18, 2023, at the 6th Floor Function Room of the NLP Building, T.M. Kalaw St., Ermita, Manila.

The initiative was prompted by the Legislative Library Service's request to enhance accessibility for their clients by integrating the link to the NLP eResources Portal (ePortal) into their site. This request aligns with the existing Terms of Agreement between NLP and the Publishers and Providers of the online databases.

The orientation sessions were designed to empower participants by guiding them through the account creation process to become NLP-authorized users. Ms. Xenia B. Romero, the dedicated eResources portal administrator of RD, facilitated presentations on the diverse online databases available in the ePortal. The sessions also featured handson navigation of the ePortal platform, ensuring that participants gained practical skills to maximize the resource.

Since May 2022, NLP has been consistently providing sessions of "NLP eResources Day" to onsite users, marking a significant effort to promote the array of online databases available for free. The primary objectives include orienting library users, cultivating their interest in exploring the ePortal platform, and broadening customer engagement. Notably, these efforts extend beyond the traditional IPauthenticated areas, allowing users remote access to the wealth of resources.

The NLP's commitment to facilitating knowledge dissemination is evident through such initiatives, creating a more inclusive and accessible learning environment for both onsite and remote users.

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CDD Hosts Successful Stakeholders' Forum on Library Acquisition

The NLP Collection Development Division (CDD), conducted the "CDD Stakeholders' Forum on Acquisition of NLP Library Materials" on June 27, 2023. The forum gathered representatives from diverse suppliers and publishing companies, specializing in foreign and Filipiniana print, electronic/multimedia resources, and databases.



The primary objective of the forum was to enlighten stakeholders about the NLP's Acquisition and Bids and Awards Committee (BAC) requirements and processes. Ms. Melody Madrid, CDD Chief; Ms. Maricel Diaz, Filipiniana Division Assistant Chief and BAC Member; and Ms. Neriza Oraba of CDD led discussions on these crucial aspects. Additionally, the forum provided valuable insights into Legal Deposit procedures.



Issues and concerns related to the procurement and delivery of library materials were openly discussed and effectively addressed during the forum. This collaborative platform served as a means to enhance communication and understanding between the NLP and its valued stakeholders, ensuring a smoother and more efficient acquisition process moving forward.

These multifaceted initiatives stand testament to the NLP's unwavering dedication to knowledge dissemination and capacity-building. By fostering practical skills, embracing digital advancements, and empowering librarv professionals nationwide, the NLP is not only preserving the past but also shaping the future of library services in the Philippines. As the journey continues, these endeavors will undoubtedly leave an indelible mark on the landscape of library sciences, making knowledge more accessible and preservation efforts more profound.

Explore these groundbreaking resources, as the NLP remains devoted to advancing research and development in the dynamic field of library and information science.

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
