NLP's Collaborative Endeavors with BIR and BARMM

In a resounding testament to inter-agency collaboration, the National Library of the Philippines (NLP) has orchestrated two initiatives pioneering aimed at transforming library services across government sectors. The first, a landmark collaboration with the Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR), and second, an exploratory meeting to improve library services in the **Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim** Mindanao (BARMM). These collaborative underscore endeavors the NLP's commitment in propelling advancements in library services nationwide.

NLP and BIR Collaborate on Koha Library Software Implementation

The NLP and BIR joined forces on August 7, 2023, signing a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) for the adoption and implementation of the Koha Library Software in the BIR Library. This collaboration marks a pivotal moment in enhancing access to information and streamlining library operations within the BIR.

The Koha Library Software, recognized for its fully featured and scalable capabilities, is a free and open-source system being utilized in the management of NLP's library resources. This strategic partnership between NLP and BIR reflects a shared commitment to harnessing innovative solutions for the betterment of library services.

The MOA signing ceremony took place at the Conference Room of the Office of the Commissioner in the BIR National Office Building and was attended by key figures from both organizations. Among the attendees were BIR Commissioner Romeo D. Lumagui, Jr., Deputy Commissioner for Operations Maridur V. Rosario, Deputy Commissioner for Marissa Cabreros, Legal Ο. Deputy Commissioner for Information Systems Ma. Rosario Charo G. Enriquez-Curiba, and Deputy Commissioner for Resource Management Teresita M. Angeles, along with other BIR staff. The event also saw the presence of NLP's top management, including NLP Director Cesar Gilbert Q. Adriano, Assistant Director Edgardo B. Quiros, and Chief of the Information Technology Division, Mr. Leonardo P. Bernabe, Ir.



The primary objective of the agreement is to establish the general terms and conditions that will govern the successful implementation of Koha in the BIR Library. Both parties are committed to ensuring a seamless process and have outlined orientations to familiarize stakeholders with the functionalities of the system.

This collaborative initiative sets a precedent for other institutions looking to enhance their library management systems. By embracing the Koha Library Software, the BIR is poised to benefit from a more efficient, user-friendly, and adaptable platform, ultimately contributing to the optimization of their library resources.

The first part of the series took place successfully in Ormoc City, Leyte, on August 29–30, 2023, followed by a second session in Zamboanga City on September 11–12, 2023. The concluding leg occurred in Legazpi City, Albay, on October 23–24, 2023.

NLP Joins 48th Meeting of Directors of ISSN National Centres

Representing the National Library of the Philippines (NLP), Director Cesar Gilbert Q. Adriano and Bibliographic Services Division Chief Jennifer B. Dimasaca participated in the 48th Meeting of the Directors of ISSN National Centres, hosted in Brussels, Belgium. The event, held from October 23–26, 2023, was made possible through the kind invitation extended by Koninklijke Bibliotheek/ Bibliotheque royale (KBR) and the International Standard Serial Number International Centre (ISSN IC).

The gathering commenced with opening messages from Sophie Vandepontseele, Director of Contemporary Collections at KBR,

and Gaelle Bequet, Director of the ISSN International Center, officially inaugurating the event. A unique warm-up exercise allowed participants to introduce themselves while sharing insights into the traditional dishes and culinary traditions of their respective nations.

Reports from Belgium, Tunisia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Nepal, Ukraine, and the ISSN IC followed, addressing critical concerns related to the ISSN system. Representatives from 37 member countries engaged in discussions during the Directors Meeting.

The subsequent days were dedicated to ISSN+ workshops, exploring new features of the database. Key features of the enhanced include search capabilities system for bibliographic records, assignment forms, title and publisher browsing, a list of title word abbreviations, data extraction in various help pages, dashboards, formats, and announcements. MARC21 fields 023, 856, and 857 were also discussed, as well as the benefits of automated ISSN-L administration, facilitating the federation of print and electronic versions of the same resource and the creation of distinct record groups.

Throughout the meeting, directors emphasized the critical role of the ISSN system in ensuring the accuracy and reliability of serial publications. Discussions also revolved around promoting the use of ISSN for all types of publications, including electronic journals and online serials. They also exchanged valuable insights on the latest trends and best practices related to ISSN, covering areas such as ISSN linked data, implementation in library its role scholarly systems, and in communication. They collectively explored strategies to enhance the visibility and accessibility of ISSN data.

The meeting concluded with a visit to the Koninklijke Bibliotheek/Bibliotheque royale (KBR) reading room, legal deposit, and the Musee Magritte Museum, marking the successful culmination of the four-day event.

Confident in the positive impact of shared insights and recommendations, the directors expressed gratitude for the valuable contributions made during the meeting. They affirmed their commitment to advancing the ISSN system and its services to publishers, libraries, and other stakeholders, ensuring its continued relevance in the dynamic landscape of global publications.

In a momentous showcase of historical significance, two Filipino artworks took center stage at the Smithsonian Institution's latest exhibition, "1898: US Imperial Visions and Revisions." Held at the National Portrait Gallery USA in Washington, D.C., the exhibition ran from April 28, 2023, to February 25, 2024, marking the first major Smithsonian Exhibition to examine the United States' intervention in Cuba and its expansion into Guam, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, and the Philippines.

Apolinario Mabini's portrait, a masterpiece by Fabián de la Rosa from the National Library of the Philippines (NLP) Collection, and Felipe Agoncillo's portrait by Félix Resurrección Hidalgo from the National Fine Arts Collection of the National Museum of the Philippines (NMP), were the Filipino treasures on display. These artworks, together with various artifacts, provided a visual narrative of the Philippine-American War (1899-1913), a pivotal chapter in the country's quest for independence and sovereignty.

The exhibition, aptly titled "1898: US Imperial Vision and Revision," commemorated the 125th anniversary of the United States acquiring overseas territories and emerging as a global power. With a focus on the impact of U.S. influence, the showcase aimed to examine debates around imperialism while shedding light on the experiences of people in the Caribbean and the Pacific, emphasizing the loss of self-determination during this critical period.

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Over ninety objects, including portraits and visual representations, delved into the perspectives of proponents and opponents of overseas expansion. The exhibition also explored the agency of individuals who played a role in shaping their political futures amid the transformative period of U.S. imperialism.

Assistant Secretary Jose Victor Chan-Gonzaga of the Department of Foreign Affairs-Office of American Affairs and Consul General Iric C. Arribas of the Philippine Embassy in the USA were also part of the delegation.

Highlighting these Filipino artworks at an international platform provided a unique opportunity for the Philippines to share pivotal moments from its history with the global community. This exhibition coincided with the ongoing celebration of the 125th anniversary of Philippine Independence and Nationhood, commemorated from June 12, 2023, to March 23, 2026. The portrayal of Mabini and Agoncillo's portraits showcased the resilience and determination of the Filipino people during a crucial period in their pursuit of autonomy.

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STREAMLINING NLP TRANSACTIONS THROUGH ONLINE PAYMENT



An orientation on Linkbiz.portal and the Landbank Government Purchase Card (GPC) was conducted by LBP-Intramuros officials, followed by the signing of Memorandum of Agreement with NLP.

The National Library of the Philippines (NLP) is advancing towards a more efficient, convenient, and secure process for service transactions for NLP products and services through an electronic payment system.

On October 13, 2023, the NLP, through the Finance and Administrative Division, facilitated an orientation on Linkbiz.portal and the Landbank Government Purchase Card (GPC) with officials and employees of the Land Bank of the Philippines (LBP) - Intramuros Branch.

The orientation was conducted by officials from LBP-Intramuros, headed by their Vice President, Mr. Renato R. Aquino, alongside other officials including Ms. Fararah Rosca M. Balog, Department Manager; Ms. Carla Jane P. Rotaiko, Senior Customer Associate; Mr. Dindo Libranda, Department Manager; Mr. Joseph Del Valle, Senior Management Associate; and Ms. Joanne Ocampo, Senior eProduct Officer. NLP Director Cesar Gilbert Q. Adriano and Assistant Director Edgardo B. Quiros, together with Division Chiefs and staff of the Cash Section headed by Elmerson Alberto, Administrative Officer V; Accounting Section headed by Geraldine Guisando, Accountant III; and Budget Section Head Marvin Vanguardia, attended the orientation.



In response to the implementation of the national government's policy indicated in Republic Act No. 11032, or the Ease of Doing

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Business and Efficient Government Deliverv Act of 2018, which aims to streamline the systems and procedures current of government services, NLP is upgrading its processes by offering an alternative and more practical way of service transactions. This orientation is part of the action taken by the Finance and Administrative Division with the goal of initiating the digitalization of NLP services during the Operational Planning of NLP for fiscal year 2024-2025 in September 2023. Once established, the portal will be fully utilized in 2024 and will serve as an alternative process for onsite transactions for clients and stakeholders of NLP.

Ms. Joanne Ocampo, LBP Senior eProduct Officer, gave a detailed presentation about LANDBANK Link.BizPortal. It is an alternative payment channel that allows clients to pay for products and services via the Internet from both government and private institutions/sectors. According to Ms. Ocampo, the Link.BizPortal will provide convenience, efficiency, safety, and faster transactions. It can also decrease the direct and indirect costs associated with physical cash and track financial flows, resulting in less corruption and theft. With this system, it will also save on operational costs of the agency while maintaining the efficiency and quality of its services.

The presentation for the LANDBANK GPC was also given by Mr. Joseph Del Valle, Senior Management Associate of LBP-Intramuros. GPC is a credit card that serves as an payment solution alternative for the procurement of eligible goods and services. In this presentation, he emphasized the features and benefits of GPC. Mr. Del Valle pointed out that through the GPC, NLP could reduce administrative costs, enhance control over expenditures, and improve liquidity management. He also added that through GPC, NLP could reduce cash and check handling, eliminate procurement lead-time, shorten the time to liquidate government obligations, and develop a database of financial information.

Another product of LBP was also presented by Mr. Dindo Libranda, Department Manager, who discussed the financial assistance that LBP could provide for Housing Loan Applications. The orientation concluded with the signing of the Memorandum of Agreement between NLP and LBP officials for the implementation of the digitalization of service transactions. NLP Directors, along with Mr. Renato R. Aquino and Ms. Joanne Ocampo, sealed their partnership through the signed Memorandum of Agreement.



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YEAR-END ASSESSMENT CONDUCTED AT NLP

The Performance Management Team (PMT) of the National Library of the Philippines (NLP), under the leadership of Dolores D. Carungui, Librarian V of the Reference Division, recently concluded a comprehensive five-day year-end assessment for 2023.
